## 4. SHARING PLANNED INITIATIVES FOR THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2017-18 AND SEEKING ADVICE FROM THE ACADEMIC COUNCIL FOR THE GROWTH OF THE INSTITUTION

The Director requested the designated office-bearers to highlight the initiatives that have been put to practice in the ongoing academic year and requested the council members to offer their advice on the same. The members were quite happy on the initiatives shared and placed their observations on each of them.

I. Re-visioning Exercise		
The re-visioning exercise was deliberated upon after discussions on the stages of this exercise that was initiated by IQAC team and taken to the leadership level which consisted of top management, representatives of academia, corporate and other stakeholders. The council members were quite appreciative of the rigour of the exercise while offering their

0	Dr. Rajen Gupta appreciated the futuristic and elaborated nature of vision description which offers a clear direction of 'where we would like to be'. However, he opined that the word 'world-class' looks a bit quite ambitious in scope and may be further redefined in context more realistic. He appreciated the mission statement that demonstrated the clarity of its elements and scope. It was also seconded by Dr. Sardana and Ms. Devyani.	Dean (A) & Programme Directors
0	Programme Educational Objectives (PEOs) were also reflected upon by the members and everyone agreed to the value that it added to programmes offered. Dr. Sardana pointed out that outlining the changing trends in the business world and predicting the future requirements of skill set and knowledge should form the bed-rock of the PEOs, as they are expectations of the future performance of the graduates after the programme completion, usually 3 to 5 years later.	
0	Dr. Sardana expressed that while laying down Graduate Attributes (GAs), one of the key features expected of the graduating student by the corporate would be the 'ability to change' and hence needs to be mentioned along with the first GA.	
0	This was seconded by Dr. Goyal who also emphasized that the students need to demonstrate it as they graduate out of programme.	
0	Dr. Sardana also brought this to forum that 'planning for self' should include professional and personal planning including career progression and financial planning. A workshop/ personality development programme may be undertaken for the students to inculcate this ability.	
0	Ms. Devyani opined that the word 'supervisory and managerial' would more indicate towards the structured levels of organization whereas most of the future organizations in coming years would move towards a boundary-less form. Hence 'mentoring' may replace the use of above said words in the first PEO.	
0	Mr. Manglik was of opinion that though in IT/ ITES and service industry the hierarchy may sublime in levels but they would stay in FMCG and manufacturing industries and 'supervisory and managerial' positions would last longer than anticipated by many thought leaders. Mr. Kamal Singh also echoed the same thought.	

<ul> <li>Mr. Singh harped upon the ethical and responsible behaviour and brought forth 'Sustainable Development Goals' (SDGs) and UN Global Compact's multi-year strategy to drive business awareness. He emphasized that the students be sensitized about the role that they as future leaders need to demonstrate and act in support of achieving the Sustainable Development Goals through PRIME (India Chapter).</li> <li>He further appreciated the Jaipuria Noida's continuous journey towards excellence through continued quality initiatives.</li> </ul>

The proposed certificate programmes were presented and deliberated upon. It was informed that 2 courses (i.e. Corporate sponsored CSR Projects & Entrepreneurship) would be mandatory while students can choose atleast one from the bouquet of 6 courses.

<ul> <li>The proposed bouquet was in alignment with the merging domains that would facilitate life-long learning as well as enable to be a differentiator for the passing out graduates from the campus.</li> <li>In light of emerging scenarios of VUCA world, handling business through the lens of the regulatory framework would be a challenging task for the graduates and hence a course on IPR/ regulations may be added to the bouquet. The same may be a part of the course of 'Legal Aspects of Management' that is offered in Term IV as a compulsory course.</li> <li>Ms. Sinha while appreciating this move expressed the need to highlight the course of 'Sustainability in Resource Management' which would assume greater importance in coming future for the corporate captains.</li> </ul>	Chair- Certification Committee & Dean (A)
