Brief Report of Inaugural Session of First Round Table Meet on Emerging Trends in Talent Acquisition

Jaipuria Institute of Management, Noida in association with National Human Resource Development Network (NHRDN) organized first round table meet on Emerging Trends in Talent Acquisition. This is first such meet organized in Noida region by NHRDN.





Guest of Honor for the occasion was Mr. Kamal Singh, Director General, NHRDN and large number of officials and members of NHRDN besides HR Managers from different organizations. Mr. Kamal Singh gave overview of the conference.

Also present on this important event and occasion was Shri Shreevats Jaipuria, Vice Chairman, Jaipuria Institute of Management. The inaugural program started with welcoming the dignitaries with a bouquet of flowers followed by traditional lighting of the lamp by the Chief Guest, other dignitaries present on the occasion, Director of the institute Dr. Rajiv R. Thakur and members of the organizing team including Dr. Abdul Qadir and Ms. Kanchan Rana. Shri Shreevats Jaipuria, in his opening remarks welcomed Shri Siddiqui, Mr. Kamal Singh and other dignitaries present on the occasion. Mr. S. Y. Siddiqui in his clear and straight to the heart thoughts, explained the relevance of the topic and discussed what the emerging trends in talent acquisition are? He explained how social media and other platforms are playing a key role in talent acquisition and he emphasized why it is more important to hire "right talent" over "top talent". Giving numerous examples of talent acquisition and retention policies used at Maruti Suzuki, he dwelled upon the change in process of hiring talent over the years since the days when he started his career at Escorts. He also mentioned why acknowledging and accepting the failure should also be a part of organization policy. He stressed upon simple HR systems rather than developing complex systems. His session and deliberations raised number of queries among students, guests and faculty who

raised varying questions right from unemployment rate to attrition rate and one audience raised the question if accepting the failure was actual practice in any organization. However Mr. Siddiqui with his patience and careful listening style answered the questions up to the satisfaction of audience citing examples from global systems. He responded to a query how money reward comes at fifth position in developing employee satisfaction. Dr. Rajiv R. Thakur summarized the proceedings and proposed Vote of Thanks. He mentioned to the audience especially students to learn finer aspect of communication skills from Mr. Siddiqui address other than the talent acquisition and retention part. He too emphasized the need of hiring and retaining right talent and he appreciated the contribution and collaboration of NHRDN with Jaipuria Institute of Management and their consistent help in raising quality standards at the institution. He thanked NHRDN, its past presidents including Mr. Siddiqui and its Director General Mr. Kamal Singh to discuss and thinking of establishing a chapter of NHRDN at Jaipuria, Noida.

FDP – Goods and Services Tax, its benefits and impacts on Indian Economy

Guest Talk - Shri Arvind Kumar - 13th October, 2016

This talk on GST was necessitated as it is a current topic and will change the way of taxation in India and paving the way for a smooth transition to India being a common market across states. The faculty were addressed by Shri Arvind Kumar who is presently working as a Deputy Secretary in the Ministry of Heavy Industries. Being an IAS officer of 1997 cadre he has also worked with Mumbai Customs, DGFT and Ministry of Finance and has been associated with framing of GST laws from 2006 onwards.

In the recent past, many potential FDIs who were once interested in setting up their manufacturing units in Kolkata or Tamil Nadu, amongst other states, were disappointed as in spite of New Delhi welcoming them, each state had their own set of laws leading to bureaucratic and procedural delays. This is exactly where GST comes in as it offers a unified market, where there will be no boundary between entrepreneur and market, said Mr. Arvind Kumar.

The current taxation regime in India encompasses majorly direct and indirect taxes. But before getting onto to GST, Mr. Kumar highlighted the pitfalls of Value Added Tax (VAT). He explained that in spite of fixing 12.50% as a uniform rate the states still had power to move below or above as per their respective state economies, i.e., there was no legal binding on the uniform rate. For example, if a laptop is assembled in Mumbai, tax is paid on the finished product in Mumbai itself. For the parts that have come from different states where tax would have been charged on them, the tax can only be claimed in the respective origin states.

Mr Kumar suggested, India is one country hence one must be free to pay anywhere and claim anywhere just like Income Tax, i.e., the Indian taxation system should move towards becoming PAN India.

GST is a modification/ extension of VAT also called as National VAT, which is prevalent in 140 countries. In India, this destination based tax was first recommended by Kelkar committee in 2004. A draft GST model was issued by the government in 2009 for public debate.

This destination based tax will reduce transaction costs and abolish the cascading effect. One of the major benefit of GST is it only requires 8 forms, 10 annexures, and only 1 challan as opposed to 495 required in total for the other taxes put together (VAT/CST, Central Excise, Service Tax). Mr. Kumar suggested that GST being destination based tax, will have positive impact on consuming States like Delhi, Bihar etc. It will reduce number of tax authorities as well as human interface leading to reduced cost of compliance and administration cost. Also, since GST is familiar taxation method for international trade communities, hence may attract Investments in India.

Mr. Kumar in hindsight spoke to the faculty on the working of GST and further moved to elaborate on its impact. In order to study the impact of GST Mr. Kumar had considered 15 countries selected on the bases of their GDP turnover. He finally worked his presentation through four countries namely, Canada, Australia, Brazil, since they were similar to India in size and Singapore, a small country with little variation in socio economic strata, thus easy to administer. Singapore began with 3% (with assurance to maintain the rate for next 5 years) increasing thereafter to 4%, 5% and 7% which is the current rate. Lower tax rate is easy to implement and acceptable to people. High rate may discourage Investment and tempt people to evade tax.





He further talked about the salient features of GST, eloquently explaining the dual structure GST levied by Central government and State government: (i) Central GST (ii) State GST and the IGST (CGST+SGST) which would apply to inter-state trade. It would be levied on all transactions of goods and service. The Centre and the States would have concurrent jurisdiction. Cross utilization of ITC between the Central GST and ITC of State GST would not be allowed to adjust against CGST common format for periodical returns, to both the Central and to the concerned State GST authorities. Each taxpayer would be allotted a PAN-linked taxpayer identification number with a total of 13/15 digits. The CGST and SGST subsumes various state taxes, however GST is not applicable at the municipality level.

With the thought that every coin has two faces, Mr. Kumar laid down the road ahead for GST by mentioning that the bill has been ratified by 50% of the States or more and the amended provisions in the constitution will be notified by Ministry of Law along with CGST /IGST

legislation by Centre and SGST legislation by States to be prepared and passed by respective legislatures, thereby paving the way for GST implementation.

The talk was well received by the faculty with many takeaways and the same could have been witnessed by the intensity of the faculty interaction with the speaker. The speaker ended on a note requesting that the faculty may have some pertinent suggestions / viewpoints which they must express through articles in newspapers and other forums.





Brief Report of the Inaugural Session of the International Conference on Management Practices for the New Economy (ICMAPRANE 2017) held on 10th February 2017

Jaipuria Institute of Management, Noida organized its' second International Conference on Management Practices for the New Economy (ICMAPRANE-17) on February 10th – 11th, 2017. The conference was being organized in association with Satakunta University of Applied Sciences (SAMK), Finland and Eastern Mennonite University, USA and University of East London, UK.

Prof. Rajan Saxena, Vice – Chancellor Narsee Monjee Institute of Management Studies was Guest of Honor and Mr. Abheek Barua, Chief Economist at HDFC Bank Limited was the Key Note Speaker for the conference.

Guests flew down from across the nation to be a part of this two days event.


















The event commenced with the recital of the Saraswati Vandana and lighting of the lamp. , This was followed by floral welcome of the guests.





Chairman of Jaipuria Institute of Management, Shri Sharad Jaipuria in his welcome remarks spoke about the vast experience that the three speakers carry and briefed the guests and audience about Late Seth Anandram Jaipuria's pioneering initiative to set up Jaipuria College in Kolkata in 1945 and the Jaipuria family long journey since then in providing superior quality education with over 10,000 current students and close to 20,000 alumni. Jaipuria Institute of Management has strength of over 100 faculty members and more than 70 visiting faculty members.

He then dwelt upon the conference theme "Management Practices for the New Economy". He said that the new economy has the potential to revolutionize a given industry through cost leadership. New business models are emerging every day breaking down the traditional differences between the supplier and the customer. He cited examples of world's largest taxi firm, Uber that owns no cars. One of the world's most popular media company, Facebook, creates no content. The world's most valuable retailer, Alibaba, carries no stock. And the

world's largest accommodation provider, Airbnb, owns no property. Hence new economy incorporates a new way of doing things across industries and functional areas.

He desired to look forward to a new economy which does business activity for the benefit of the society, and takes care of the people who have historically been exploited by classism, gender bias, racism and other systems of oppression.

Director of the institute Dr. Rajiv R. Thakur welcomed the guests and participants and recalled how decision to hold with clear topic in mind was taken a year back in valedictory function of first international conference of Jaipuria, Noida. Since economy is a continually changing process hence the theme of conference will remain contemporary always and he announced that Jaipuria, Noida will be promoting the theme as a brand and organize its future conferences with same brand name.

Citing world as a global village today, businesses are affected by even the slightest change or issue in any part of the world. Sustainability of businesses therefore depend upon quick adaptation to the changed circumstances and adopting new management practices that are in tune and line with evolving new economy. He quoted examples of US President Election and demonetization as two key events that have shaken entire business scenario world over. He said that the new economy may see demise of once successful companies and can also witness emerging of new businesses from nowhere or from scratch.

He also acknowledged the contribution of organizing team of Mr. Jitender Sharma, Dr. Vinita Srivastava and Dr. Shikha Bhatia who in spite of various difficulties and hurdles that keep coming regularly successfully organized the whole show. The organizers were felicitated with mementos for their contribution.

Dr. Rajiv Thakur mentioned that for the conference over 200 inquiries were received, followed by 146 abstracts and finally 102 full paper were received. After double blind review process, 65 papers were selected and after last minute withdrawal of few papers, finally 59 papers were included in conference proceedings. Dr. Rajiv Thakur highlighted how the event was being

broadcasted not only to all the three campuses live but to various colleges through online learning and training software, Impartus.



Mr. Abheek Barua, Chief Economist, HDFC bank in his key note address spoke about other facets of economy and the recent major events like Brexit and Demonetization in India and their effects on the new economy. He also spoke about how every nation is competing against each other trying to form their own kind of globalization. He described economic implications of international politics and mention China, India and Africa are the countries to look for in the coming years for growth after adopting protectionism policies by USA.

Chief Guest Dr. Rajeev Kumar, who started his career as a professor only and wittingly coining the term "lapse professor" for himself talked about how our youth needs to be trained in different dimensions of management as an initiative to fulfill the demands of the new and innovation prone economy. He also emphasized on how much it is important for our generation-Y to understand the importance of job creation highlighting the implications of the current scenarios portraying significant drops in the graph of the same. He talked about how the fourth revolution i.e. internetworking using technology has entirely changed the world after the earlier three revolutions wheel, industrialization and computerization. He provided key mantras of success in the new economy.

Finally, Prof. Rajan Saxena, spoke about the revolution in the economy and how this 21st century belongs to Asia, specially China and India. He emphasized how the management

education needs to be changed keeping in mind the changing environment and also mentioned leadership traits for the new economy.







At the end of inaugural session, Shri Shreevats Jaipuria, Vice Chairman, Jaipuria Institute of Management, delivered the vote of thanks and mentioned how listening such wonderful speakers was a treat to ears. He also advised the students to understand and adopt the learnings from these sessions into practice. Finally the inaugural session end with presentation of mementos to the guests and group photograph.





Panel Discussion on UNION Budget February 16th 2017

For a management student, it is utterly important to stay updated with what is happening around them. At Jaipuria as we say we want our students to "Be Ready" therefore, guest talks is an integral part of our curriculum. Today, the Finance club in collaboration with Economics Area, of #Jaipuria, #Noida, organized a panel discussion for the students on UNION BUDGET 2017 covering topics like Taxation, Rural and Agricultural facet of the budget, Banking and the impact on commodity exchange market. The discussion began with Dr. Rajiv Thakur addressing the audience with some erstwhile practices relating to the budget, and the current scenario. Also, he concluded by giving a motto "Be inquisitive about the why's and how's".



CA Mr. Mohd. Salim, told the students about how several things have changed from the taxation angle for an individual, he covered all the relevant factors and also shared with the students, facts like, Contribution of taxes in the total revenue of the Government is 70% and the growth in the tax deposition this year was 35%. Mr. Vijay Sardana shared that "This country needs executives and not strategies". He emphasized that the focus should be more on actions than plans. He stressed upon the fact that MBA graduates should stay in close touch with the Economic Surveys and read the budget to get a deeper understanding. The three things, GST, E-payments, and Demonetization should be studied together to get a better grip on what is happening. Managers should be ready to work in a more transparent environment, as there are going to be some major changes in the Consumer laws and the fastest growing Social Media. The knowledge will help create wealth. Transferring of money to the farmers without transfer

of knowledge can't help them in multiplying the money, this was something that the new budget lacked to focus on. He also touched upon various other constituents such as contract farming and dairy infrastructure before ending on a beautiful note "Causing a change is our responsibility".





Mr. Sunil Pant, a former general manager at SBI, quoted Deng "It doesn't matter whether a cat is white or black, as long as it catches mice". The finance sector of India constitutes up to roughly 73% of banks, 15% of Insurance and remaining of mutual funds. Capitalization of banks is an important factor for the government which includes Economic Capital, Risk Mitigation, and Regulatory capital. The myth out there is that India's economy is decoupled with that of the world's, whereas India's economy is closely related to the world's. The shocks' ripple effects are the fastest in the finance sector. He concluded that the Electronic footprint that we are leaving everywhere is going to be one factor to watch out for in the near future, even in the finance sector. At the end we had with us Mr. Vipul Srivastava telling us about how the commodity exchange market is affected by the changing crude oil prices and a rise in them is actually going

to be beneficial for our country. He also touched upon various other important components relating to the same. The seminar was concluded by Professor Ritika Gugnani thanking all the members present.

This has direct impact on manufacturing organizations that have to work with less of everything: human efforts, manufacturing space, finance sources, etc. He also discussed on the need to consider Lean not in manufacturing only but in all industries. He explained by discussing examples of Lean implementation and its benefits.



Prof. A.K Rajpal proposed Vote of Thanks and facilitated **Dr. Pandya** with a memento as a token of appreciation. It was followed by an interaction between members of International Relations Committee and the guest to explore the possibilities of collaboration.



During the deliberations Ms. Pooja Khullar gave a brief idea on the existing collaboration of Sheffield in India and talked about the possibilities of association.

Thereupon **Dr. Poonam** suggested 2 months Internship Program for post graduate students of Sheffield University wherein Jaipuria's Training and placement cell would help students in getting internship in good companies in Delhi/NCR.

- Dr. Rajiv R Thakur proposed to have short term study tours including industry visits, cultural programs, and classroom studies for undergraduate students of Sheffield to provide them exposure and better industry interface.

Brief Report of the Visit of Dr. Alexander Broich, EVP and President International - Cengage

Learning to Jaipuria, Noida on

12 December 2016

Dr. Alexander Broich, EVP and President International - Cengage Learning to Jaipuria, Noida along with his other four colleagues visited Jaipuria, Noida yesterday at 3.00 pm for a meeting with Director and faculty members. He is currently on visit to India to understand Indian Higher Education System and to develop a synergy between International Higher Education System and Indian System and to explore how Cengage Learning can be a partner in imparting quality education as per actual industry requirements.

In his presentation and interaction with Faculty, Librarian and Director, he explained how Cengage has develop e-learning applications in consultation with industry so as to develop students that are industry ready and not just passed the examination. He explained how their e-learning system which is highly interactive one can be integrated with our existing LMS i.e. Moodle and what are the additional advantages of using these innovative learning applications.

They currently offer two different models one primarily focusing on student self-learning at his/her own pace wherein other than e-book material, audio, videos, simulation games, glossary, dictionary, question bank and pronunciation tools etc. have been inbuilt in the system; the other one further includes assessment tools for the instructors apart from all above

features. A faculty can easily keep a watch on students' individual progress and can also identify the week and strong areas for most of the students using the facilities available.

Faculty can also add additional notes and even integrate other publishers e-resources to this system provided they have authorized access to the same.

During the course of presentation and interaction, it was mutually decided to map our courses on offer during third and sixth trimester and their products on offer for the same. Not only that, it was also offered by Dr. Alexander and his colleague Mr. Ramchandani that two of our courses one from IT and other probably from communication/presentation or any other agreed subject can be run as a pilot project to see the efficacy of the system and how much development they bring to the students' performance level. This pilot project can be run in all campuses together if finalized and agreed upon by all campuses.

Director, Dr. Rajiv R. Thakur, concluded the session with suggesting Dr. Alexander to visit next time to the institute with a full comparative study between Indian versus other nations higher education system and telling him that Jaipuria will surely look into the efficacy of the system and shall compare the same with other such offerings from other publishers and based upon their outcome of the pilot run in at least two subjects will take up further necessary steps.

Essay Writing Competition


