FACULTY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

Teachers are the true asset of any educational institution who provides constant knowledge and exposure to their students and, for same they prepare themselves through various methods which require lot of efforts and time.

Like all other institutions who invest in their teachers for their welfare and knowledge enhancement, Jaipuria Institute of Management, Noida, on 20th December 2018, in association with Research Club, organized a workshop on Faculty Development Program on the theme "Covariance-Based Structural Equation Modeling {CB-SEM}".

The guest speaker for this workshop was Dr. Damodar Suar from IIT Kharagpur. This workshop also saw the presence of faculties from institutions like Amity Business School, IMS Noida, CDAC and IMT Ghaziabad along with faculties of Jaipuria Institute of Management. The workshop started with felicitating the guest speaker by Dr. Surendra Kumar. The workshop aimed at training faculties with newer version of SPSS 20 using AMOS to enhance the visualization of data and to increase the efficiency and consistency of data for a particular research. Also, modeling concept was used that has application of equation which further gives more control over data and better insights. The session was fruitful for all the faculties, learnings of which

can be incorporated in their skill set and can be further taught to students. The workshop was interactive and Dr. Damodar delivered great insights on the theme. The Research Club students along with Prof. Shalini Srivastava were also present to attend the workshop. The session came to an end with gathering at Lunch which was organized by the committee followed by escorting of guest faculties.

Industry interface on career and job opportunities in Finance area 10:30AM – 11:45AM

Ms. Megha Sharma, Head Talent Acquisition Team, North Zone, Janalakshmi, spoke about the job opportunities in the finance domain especially in the BFSI. She explained the concept of micro finance and the job opportunities in the said area and with large commercial banks and small banks. She sensitized the students on various skill sets needed to start a career in the BFSI.



Industry Speaker: Ms. Shewta Sharma, Founder- Dhruvan Services Faculty Coordinator: Dr. Pratibha Wasan

The session began with Dr. Wasan felicitating and introducing the guest speaker to the students. The session had detailed discussion on understanding of what financial services are and what different roles it offers. Financial services as an industry is for decision makers and not decision takers. As takers are followers and not leaders, the speaker motivated students to lead and not to follow. She also asked students to learn well by citing examples to show that treasurers command salary based on their knowledge and an analyst due to his research skills. Ms. Shewta motivated students to develop out of the box thinking, taking charge of their tasks and establishing accountability in their performance. She advised to students to research well on their dream company and offered tips on how to research about a company.

The speaker stated that qualification and initiative were the criteria for growth and also discussed on how one moves across the corporate ladder and how promotions keep shrinking towards the top. She highlighted for the students that as they will move to the upper ladder, more struggle will start and speed of growth will lower.

Ms. Sharma outlined various job profiles in Finance area and discussed in details on the following competencies needed by financial services companies.

Industry Speaker: Mr. Rajesh Chaudhary, Head HR, Fortis Healthcare Faculty Coordinator: Dr. Rajesh Sharma

Mr. Rajesh Chaudhary, Head HR, Fortis Healthcare was the guest speaker in Audi I. He has 15 years of work experience in companies like Pizza Hut, Domino's, Pantaloon & DS group.

He was given a floral welcome and introduced to audience by Dr. Rajesh Sharma. Mr. Chaudhary began his speech by giving the details of services sector and opportunities in Sales & Marketing. He discussed the career graphs of MBA students in different sectors. He also discussed the various OD interventions for improving the performance of Sales and Marketing Teams. Then the session was opened for Q & A. The students actively participated in the discussion and posed questions. The session closed with vote of thanks.



Industry Speaker: Mr. Abhishek Bhasin, Regional Head, Home Credit Finance Ltd. Faculty Coordinator: Dr. Banasree Dey The session began with the introductory comments of Dr. Dey who introduced the theme of the session. She introduced the guest speaker, Mr. Bhasin to the students. Prof. Lalit Sharma welcomed the guest with a bouquet of flowers. It was an interactive session wherein Mr. Bhasin engaged the students with discussion and examples. He began by highlighting the difference between Marketing and Sales before pointing out the importance of Sales as an initial career option for freshers. He shared his conviction that an initial exposure in sales would help students to acquire the necessary experience of interacting with customers and channel members which would eventually stand them in good stead throughout their career. He moved on to a discussion regarding 'why choose a sales career' and justified sales as a lucrative career option using examples from his own experience. He pointed out that even a few years in sales provides excellent opportunities for networking. He also shared certain career opportunities in the field of Sales and Marketing. Towards the end, Mr. Bhasin shared some guidelines regarding preparing for a sales career as well as a few downsides of this option. Thereafter, the guest answered the queries of eager students. The session ended with a vote of thanks from Dr. Dey.





Session on case based pedagogy

A number of leading B-schools world-wide have been using case based teaching learning as an important pedagogical tool in sharpening the critical thinking and problem solving skills of the management graduates. This student-centric approach of teaching learning emphasizes participatory and dialogical technique of engaging students through group discussions of actual events. This offers a sound platform for providing an 'experiential' learning through reflection or experimentation. The sessions led by Dr. Vinita Srivastava, Dr. Rajesh Sharma, Dr. Pratibha Wasan, Dr. Swati Agarwal and Dr. Abhijit Nair who engaged students in discussions of different business related scenarios that resembled or typically were real world examples. The students were actively engaged in these sessions as active participants while the faculty played the role of facilitating the discussions towards a logical conclusion.

Industry interface on career and job opportunities in IT and Operations area

The students were very excited about this session. The session was graced by Mr. Rajesh Tripathi & Mr. Kundan Raj Singh. Mr. Rajesh Tripathi started with a hard fact of life that skills and knowledge are worthless when they aren't put to use. Experience, no matter how vast, is useless when it is not shared with others. The smaller your business the more likely you are to be an expert in your field; transferring those skills to others is relatively easy. But you can't train enthusiasm, a solid work ethic, and great interpersonal skills--and those traits can matter a lot more than any skills a candidate brings.

According to one study, only 11% of the new hires that failed in the first 18 months failed due to deficiencies in technical skills. The vast majority failed due to problems with motivation, willingness to be coached, temperament,

and emotional intelligence.





Finally he shared that we can train almost any skill, but it's nearly impossible to train attitude. Candidate who lacks certain hard skills as a cause for concern, but the candidate who lacks interpersonal skills and enthusiasm are giant red flag. He also shared many live examples of industries like Manufacturing, Telecom, IT and Pharmaceuticals. Vote of thanks was delivered by Mr. Narayan Samant who requested the guest for continued mentoring of the students. As per overall feedback it was really a very fruitful and enjoying session for the students.

Business Orientation Project (BOP) Presentations (July 7, 2017)

"Business Orientation Project" competition was announced at the time of admission for all first year students. Three themes were given for the competition.

- o Study of a Business on the Street
