Date of Activity: 6th August 2017.


Nature of the Activity: Social Initiative

Brief about the activity:

The Social Responsibility Committee (SRC) of Jaipuria Institute of Management, Lucknow started first social initiative on 6th August 2017. The members and volunteers of SRC headed by Prof. Reena Agarwal, faculty coordinator social responsibility committee and Ms. Anjali Dimri, student coordinator social responsibility committee in association with Prithvi Innovations, an NGO, led by Founder cum Secretary Mrs. Anupama Gupta decided to plant trees along the Lucknow Hardoi highway pavement and motivate local vendors to take care of these samplings.



Brief about the Activity:



ROAD SAFETY AWARENESS PHASE 1



Nature of the Activity: Social Initiative


Brief about the Activity:

Social Responsible Committee of Jaipuria Institute of Management, Lucknow organized an "AWARENESS DRIVE" on 10th September, 2017 to make people aware about the need to give way to ambulances and other road safety measures. The program was organized under the guidance of Prof. Reena Agarwal, Faculty Coordinator, SRC. The program was coordinated by Ms. Anjali Dimri, Senior Coordinator. The central theme of the initiative was to "Promote the use of the Helmets" and "Give way to Ambulance". India accounts for about 10% of road crash fatalities worldwide. In terms of absolute numbers, more people die in road crashes in India than anywhere else in the world. According to the World Health Organization (WHO), the death rate per 100,000 populations for road traffic accident has increased from 16.8 in 2009 to 24.9 in 2016. The first phase of the activity was planned from the Institute to Manoj Pandey Chauraha in Gomti Nagar Lucknow. The members of the SRC along with the student volunteers from Batch 2016-2018 and 2017-2019 assembled at the college campus at 9:00 AM. All the volunteers made their own slogans and hoardings in a chart and the rally was started. Students were telling slogans such as "Helmet lagao jyan bachao", "Give way to ambulance", "Mat Karo Itni Masti Zindagi nahi hai itni sasti". At the Patrakarpuram crossing in Gomti Nagar Lucknow a small "Nukkad Naatak" was conducted by the SRC members and volunteers to promote the use of helmet and give way to the ambulance. Then, the volunteers spoke with the commuters to use helmets and give way to an ambulance by sticking pamphlets on their vehicles. Mr. Sudhir Pratap Bhavnagar from Civil Defense Department was also part of our program. The rally came to an end after students reached to the college. The rally was a great success in changing the mindset of people.


CAREER COUNSELLING

Date of Activity: 6th November 2017



Type of Activity: Social Cause


Brief About the Activity:



Brief About the Activity:




SRC conducted this activity for the sole purpose to promote child education for those who are deprived of it, as every child has a right for education.




Activity concluded with distribution of bananas and biscuits to all the children in that area by the volunteers and members.




AIDS DAY


Date of Activity: 01st December 2017



Type of Activity: Social Cause


Brief About the Activity:





Brief About the Activity



HOODIE DONATION


Date of Activity: 15th December 2017




Brief About the Activity:




Brief About the Activity:

Activity 5: General Awareness Quiz




Activity 6: Talent Hunt


























BUY SMALL HELP ALL PHASE 2

Brief About the Activity:


