

- 3) Mutual Student Exchange Program and Internship Opportunities


She is also undertaking pedagogical and educational activities at WelTec and Whitireia, New Zealand for a period two months. Her visit has already started showing results from the day-1.


# Prof. Poonam Sharma's visit to Wellington campuses of WelTec and Whitireia

Dr. Poonam Sharma flew to Wellington to visit all the three Wellington campuses of WelTec and Whitireia from 12th – 16th November, 2018. She was given campus tour to the Porirua, Petone and the Wellington city campuses. It was yet another remarkable week for her.

WelTech It is a tertiary institution training around 8000 students offering a wide range of industry-led qualifications through to degree and postgraduate programmes. It is one of New Zealand's oldest education institutions and the second-oldest in the capital city. Their home campus is in **Petone**, one of the most beautiful campuses of WelTech.

Optionally, another proposal discussed was Credit Earning Programme Exchange for a trimester wherein Jaipuria students can pick an elective or electives and complete the same in Whitireia campus. However, this arrangement might take some time on both sides as this needs approval from the concerned authorities on both ends.

**Prof. Poonam** then met **Prof. Mick Jays, Head of School – Business, WelTech and Whitireia** where they discussed about the viability of Faculty Exchange. Mick expressed his willingness and interest for sending

a faculty from Whitireia at Jaipuria Institute of Management for teaching, and joint research initiatives in the upcoming year. This relationship could be built further for inbound faculty exchange as it materializes.

She also met Mr. Ashok Prabhu, Manager Research and Innovation, for collaborative research opportunities. As they are very keen on it, they assured to take promising steps in this direction.

It was a week of productive meetings and networking with the HOD's and staff of WelTech and Whitireia at Wellington
